What is the college of commissioner science?

It is an annual conference of council, district, unit, and roundtable commissioners. The college of commissioner science was developed to provide the structure for a full day of learning and fellowship. This highlight of the year is an informative, morale enhancing, and team-building event formatted after college courses and degrees. Throughout the day, participants may attend and/or teach a number of classes. The reason for offering a number of courses is to provide ongoing practical up-to-date training for all commissioners. Do I have to pre-register?

YES, **pre-registration is required** to ensure that we have adequate materials for each participant and a reservation for our luncheon.

Are there any fees? What do the fees cover?

Can I register for only part of the day?

However if, by necessity, it is impossible to be there for the first class or you have to leave early because of a previous commitment, then enroll. However it will cost you the whole fee and your classes will be held for your degree in the future.
